At-Risk Student Findings

Continuing into FY 2011, the At-Risk intervention process is in place to allow the professor to report students who may be having issues in the classroom, such as weak login activity and missing assignments. Professors may also be concerned for a student because of a medical illness or personal obligation. These issues may lead to student success challenges.

The eCore team will contact the student outside the classroom and provide additional external support to the student. Students are counseled in corrective measures and provided options for resources available to them to get back on track in the class. Students are encouraged to contact instructors and work out a re-plan.

The student may be reported more than one time in a course, and the student may be reported for more than one course. Each individual reporting is an at-risk incident.
