

Proctored Online Exams for eCore Courses

In an effort to heighten security and reduce costs, eCore has moved away from paper-based exams. Instead, eCore encourages instructors to use Desire2Learn, i.e., GoVIEW for their exams. Since Summer 2009, eCore faculty generally use proctored online tests for midterms or finals to assess a student's progress in the course in a secure environment. Students in online courses must fulfill their responsibilities in scheduling and taking a proctored exam.

Approved eCore Testing Sites and Proctors

A student may request to add a testing center to the List of Approved eCore Testing Sites & Proctors. According to eCore policies, only public testing centers (college, university, library or Army base education centers) with adequate access to GoVIEW are able to proctor exams and may be added to the List of Approved Proctors. The eCore Testing Coordinator carefully screens each requested testing center.

Each proctor from an approved testing site must have the ability to use the following:

- A valid and working e-mail address
- Internet access for students taking online exams delivered via GoVIEW

MAJOR FINDINGS

- 90.82% of students participated in their proctored exams. This is an increase from 88.44% in FY 2015.
- eCore Testing reached out to students who missed exam. 31.48% of the 4,803 exams were recovered.
- Since FY 2007 eCore Testing has had an average annual growth in exams of 20.27%, with growth from FY 2015 to FY 2017 of 43.04%.
